Present 3 images - pedicure, manicure, artificial nails: show design & French Nail polish/french/natural look with minimal art/reality art as requested by everyday clients - NO ACRYLIC / HARD GEL

JUDGE 1

Instant Impact

Does the collage have a 'wow factor' that commands attention? Are your eyes drawn to the nails in this collage of images? (10pts)

Clarity of Image & Nails

Is the collage a clear journey & all images in focus? Are the nails well photographed? (Evaluate if too much post production/editing has taken place & nails appear contrived & unrealistic) (10pts)

JUDGE 2

Overall Styling

Have all the elements of the collage been considered and well executed with thought & consideration- does it work as a collage of imagery presenting a nail business? (10pts)

Originality

The overall look must be an original interpretation; unusual, striking & creative. Does the collage project this? (10pts)

JUDGE 3

Complexity & Effort

Does this collage showcase skill, intelligence, creativity & marketing acumen? (10pts)

A Portfolio Presentation

Did the nail professional present his/herself well? How likely are you to sign up as a client based on this portfolio? **(20pts)**

JUDGE 4

Design & Layout

Has the card/advert been designed with creativity & intelligence? Does the eye move comfortably across the scene viewing a desirable colour palette. (10pts)

Marketing Prowess

As a marketing tool, does this A5 window into the nail tech's business give a strong & overall feel their business & offering? Can you feel their style & personality in this marketing montage? Does it offer the correct business insights? (20pts)

Total score out of - 100pts

1 - Unacceptable

2 - Not quite a 1, but still needs a lot of work

3 - Below average skill level

4 to 5 - Average skill level

6 to 7 - Above average skill level

8 - Very good, well on the way to a winning technique

9 - Virtually flawless, excellent skill

10 - Flawless in every way, no improvement possible
